Camping Rules and Regulations:

Applicants must be 18 years or older and are responsible for the group's compliance with the rules and regulations.

Refunds must be requested at least 2 weeks in advance of the reservation date and are subject to a \$10 cancellation fee.

1. Check-in: 4 p.m. Checkout: 1 p.m.

You may check in early, but check-in must be by 4:00 pm. More info on early departure policy: https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/state-parks/faq

- 2. Visitors who are not staying the night: Any visitor who will be at the campground and is not staying overnight must pay parking fees and leave the park when it closes.
- **3. Cars parked overnight:** Only up to 8 vehicles are allowed to park overnight. All overnight vehicles must have an overnight hangtag present at all times that is picked up at the Park Office. Information on each overnight vehicle must be reported on this application, and parking fees per day the vehicle is in the park must be paid.
- **4. Gate Opener:** You will be issued 1 gate opener to leave and return to the park. You must return the opener to the Park Office when you check out.
- **5. Quiet Hours:** Please respect your neighbors. Sound and light travel, so lower your voices, radios, and lanterns during quiet hours. Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Generators are not allowed in campgrounds.
- **6. May I hang a lantern in a tree?** Nails and hot lanterns leave permanent wounds in trees so please use lantern hangers if provided.
- 7. Pets are permitted in enclosed areas on a leash no longer than 6 feet. Please clean up after your pet. Pets must be attended at all times
- **8.** Are campfires allowed? Help prevent wildfires. Keep outdoor campfires small and contained within the grill/fire ring provided. Fires must always be attended to and extinguished when left. Chainsaws are prohibited. We enforce statewide or local burn bans and the spring prohibition of fires before 4 p.m., which is from February 15th April 30th.
- **9. Natural surroundings:** It is illegal to remove, destroy, cut down, scar, mutilate, injure, deface, take, or gather in any manner any tree, flower, fern, shrub, rock or plant, historical artifact, or mineral in any park unless a special permit has been obtained for scientific collecting. Edible fruits, berries, fungi, or nuts may be collected for personal or individual use only and under certain conditions. Contact the park for further information.
- **10. Wastewater, litter, and garbage:** Please use the trash dumpsters if available or pack all trash out in our trash-free parks. The releasing of balloons is not allowed. Decorative balloons must be deflated and disposed of as trash. Portable showers that do not drain to wastewater storage tanks are prohibited by state law. Collected wastewater must be disposed of properly.
- 11. May I bring alcoholic beverages? State law permits alcohol use only in private areas (inside a cabin or camping unit) or in areas designated on permits issued by the Virginia Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control.
- **12. Smoking** is prohibited in all public buildings and within 25 feet of their entrances. It is also prohibited in all cabins, lodges, and meeting facilities. Smoking is not allowed in snack bars, amphitheaters, pool complexes, and all beach areas, even those not designated for swimming. Guests should properly dispose of cigarette butts.
- **13. Trails:** Help prevent trail erosion. Walk along designated trails only. Mountain bikes are permitted only on roads and bike trails, not hiking trails. Our trails will take you to the most scenic areas of your park. Please don't create your own trail.
- 14. Fireworks: Fireworks are prohibited.
- **15. Fishing:** You must have a current valid fishing license. Virginia Freshwater, Maryland Bay and Coastal, and Potomac Fishery Commission Licenses will work.
- **16. Swimming:** There are no designated swimming areas along the Potomac River at the park. Beaches are not guarded, and swimming is at your own risk.
- 17. Metal detectors: Metal detectors are not allowed.
- **18. Drones and other aircraft:** Drones, other unmanned aerial vehicles, including remote control aircraft, and aircraft in general cannot be flown in state parks pursuant to 4VAC5-30-400.
